- 1. Meeting called to order at 5:43 p.m.
- 2. Open Forum.
- 3. Minutes: C. Roundtree-Baaqee moved to approve the minutes of the July 2, 2018 Public Art Advisory Committee meeting. J. Kesseler seconded. Motion passed unanimously.
- 4. Action Item: Review and Approve a Temporary Art Installation for Frank Ogawa Plaza: "Mutual Air" by Artist Rosten Woo in Collaboration with the Exploratorium. Public Art Coordinator Kristen Zaremba provided background, noting that staff have worked with City Hall / Frank Ogawa Plaza facilities management to identify appropriate locations and anticipate technical installation details to ensure a successful project. Artist is Residence Rosten Woo and Exploratorium Program Manager Kirstin Bach presented the project overview and intent to install approximately 30 sculptural chimes which monitor air quality, at locations throughout the City, beginning with the 'anchor sites' at the Chabot Space and Science Center and the Oakland Museum. Committee members complimented the concept and provided technical feedback regarding installation specifications. Woo noted that ideally chimes will also be sited at Raimondi and DeFremery Parks, as well as at the Rotary Nature Center Motion: J. Kesseler moved to approve the temporary art installation, "Mutual Air" by Exploratorium Artist in Residence artist Rosten Woo for Frank Ogawa Plaza and sites throughout Oakland, as appropriate. A. Cummings seconded. Motion passed unanimously.
- 5. Action Item: Review and Approve Final Designs for the Rainbow Recreation Center Public Art Project: "Cultural Wavelengths" by Artist Johanna Poethig. Zaremba provided a project update, noting selected artist Johanna Poethig's professional capacity and flexibility to

develop a successful and implementable design within the tight schedule allotted. The design received unanimous support from the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission at their September 12<sup>th</sup> meeting. Poethig provided an overview of her concept and design refinement process, including workshops with youth during summer programs at the adjacent Digital Arts and Culinary Academy, to arrive at the final design concept entitled "Cultural Wavelengths," composed of a single glass mosaic sculpture approximately 60' long by 10' high, for the entry façade of the new facility located at 5800 International Boulevard, as illustrated in the presentation. PAAC members complimented the symmetry of the composition and the artist's ability to convey a timelessness to the composition with color and abstraction while celebrating the youth from the center. Motion: P. Valdez moved to approve the final design for the Rainbow Recreation Center Public Art Project by artist Johanna Poethig. J. Kesseler seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

- 6. Informational Item: Staff Updates on Pending Projects and Program Activity
  - a. Measure DD: Gardens at Lake Merritt Gates Project; 10<sup>th</sup> St.; Estuary Park; Lakeside Green Streets. Zaremba reported updates on the Oakland Museum's plans to address the sculptures sited along the Channel and at Estuary Park, noting that museum staff have agreed to attend a future meeting to provide a report on the proposed plans. Estimates for the on-site general contractor's installation of Shawn Lovell's Garden Gates are much higher than originally anticipated. To cover installation costs for this and the Lakeside Green Streets / Wowhaus Project, additional Measure DD funds will need to be allocated from the Lake Merritt category. Staff are working to determine the feasibility of alternative approaches.
  - **b. MacArthur Gateway Arches Project Update.** Artist Eric Powell is currently developing shop drawings for the project.
  - c. Private Percent for Art Updates Many new projects are being presented for approval, in most cases for smaller scale construction nearing completion with a pre-selected artist and limited funds for artwork. Staff are working with applicants to determine if their proposals are compliant and continuing to encourage other City staff and applicants to start the process earlier. A few applicants are requesting reallocation of funds for off-site work, in accordance with the recently adopted ordinance changes. Staff are working on internal coordination with other City departments to acknowledge and implement these requests.



#### **Maintenance Plan**

We've reserved a portion of our overall budget for on-going maintenance of the proposed work. The parties responsible for organizing the maintenance will be Ryan Dawkins, who will contract with The Illuminaries to ensure the integrity of the initial design is intact. The anticipated lifespan of the artwork is 5-7 years, at which time, the artwork can be refurbished or a new visual proposal can be presented.

#### **Materials & Methods**

Once the site is cleaned and primed, our artists will begin installing the proposed artwork using spray cans with various types of caps for spray density, depth and style. A platform will be rented to ensure that the plants and flowers don't get damaged, but also to adjust the height for the artists to be able to reach the top of the wall easily and comfortably.

#### Permissions & Waiver of Proprietary Rights for Artwork on City Property

- 1. Permission is hereby granted to Ryan Dawkins, the Illuminaries, and its employees, contractors, and agents to enter upon certain property owned by the City located at 550 El Embarcadero, Oakland, California, for the sole purpose of painting a mural on the Grand Ave exterior facing wall. The mural shall substantially conform to the rendering in the Final Artwork Proposal as reviewed and approved by the Public Art Advisory Commission. Licensee and Artist shall perform the Artwork in accordance with the Project Specifications. In order to respect the residents in the neighborhood, Licensee shall, at all times, minimize noise and bright lights from the movement of trucks, trailers, and any equipment on the site, especially during the hours of 9 p.m. and 7 a.m. No generators may be operated on this site.
- 2. The mural will be maintained for 10 years.
- 3. Changes, alterations, modifications, and removal of the mural must be made in collaboration with the Oakland Public Library and the City of Oakland.

Re: Higher Learning Mural - Lakeview Library - Community Outreach

I began outreach to the community and library patrons in February 2018 by hosting my first meeting with the Friends of the Lakeview Library. They helped shape the tone, make necessary changes to the project and schedule our community forum. For the April 2018 event, we advertised online, flyered the neighborhood and talked to local business, inviting them to provide feedback. The meeting resulted in additional edits and a request to host another, larger community meeting in September.

For the 2nd meeting, we leveraged the OPL website and printed newsletter to spread the word, flyered the neighborhood and spoke to neighbors and business owners on Grand Ave. In addition to a positive 90 minute discussion and Q&A with 30 community members, we ran a survey from September 1st through September 15th with a 161 'yes' 12 'no'.

This is my community. I live and work a few blocks from the library, am an active school volunteer, Oak Ed Fund board member, and have a strong desire to positively make an impact in my neighborhood. The library is also groundzero for the Oakland Turkey Trot and offers an daily engagement piece, proof of our commitment, and promotion for the library's existence.



#### SUMMARY

The Rainbow Recreation Center Project has received a Gift in Place from Project Backboard which includes teens working with Oakland artist Muzae Sesay to develop designs to be painted onto the two renovated basketball courts. Mr. Sesay is completing 3 design options based on the work with the teens, and the final shall be selected at a future date by the teens. The three options are being presented to the Public Art Advisory Committee (PAAC) for information and general review.

#### **BACKGROUND**

On June 5, 2018, City Council approved the recommendation to receive a gift in place from Project Backboard for the Rainbow Recreation Center located at 5800 International Boulevard, Oakland CA 94621.

Project Backboard is a nonprofit devoted to ensuring all communities have a safe and inviting place to play outdoor basketball by renovating public outdoor courts and collaborate with artists to create unique works of art for the surface of the court. The courts resurfacing utilizes standard court color coatings and techniques.

During the summer 2018, Mr. Sesay provided the opportunity for teens at the Digital Arts and Culinary Academy (DACA) to work on the development of three design concepts for the exterior courts. In the near future, the teens will select one of the concepts as the work to be painted onto the two exterior basketball courts.

Because of tight timing coordination, the necessity to complete this gift in place at the same time as the capital improvement project and the contracting for the gift in place still to be initiated, approval is out of typical sequence and presentation to PAAC is in advance of the Park & Recreation Advisory Commission (PRAC), scheduled for October 10, 2018.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

The gift in place has no negative impact to the City and completes work (renovate basketball court) that has been identified as a community wish list item to the existing capital improvement project. Upon approval by PAAC, the City will execute the necessary contracts with Project Backboard/parties to perform the work.

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

Staff recommends that the Public Art Advisory Committee review and approve the three design options by artist Muzae Sesay, created in collaboration with the teens of DACA, with the final selection to be made by the teens of DACA.

#### **Project Narrative**

Project Backboard is an effort to ensure all communities have a safe and inviting place to play outdoor basketball. We renovate public outdoor basketball courts and collaborate with artist to create unique works of art for the surface of the court using standard court color coatings and techniques. By addiding artwork to the surface of outdoor basketball courts we help parks become busier, safer, cleaner and more inviting for families, young women and girls.

Rainbow Recreation Center (the "RRC") is in the middle of a \$13.7 million dollar renovation but, however, no funding is available to renovate the existing outdoor basketball courts which are showing significant cracks and root damage. We will remove the existing asphalt and replace with new asphalt, resurfacer and color coating. We will use color coating to install a work of art by Oakland artist Muzae Sesay.

Muzae has already held information sessions with young people attending the Digital Arts and Caulinary Academy adjacent to the RRC and he is using information gathered during those sessions to help inform the creating of the basketball court art.

Two design concept narratives:

(Design #1 Our Rainbows: A design that utilizes the dimensions of the basketball courts to depict reflecting, diverse worlds. Four irregular colored rainbows mark the three point lines and represent the beauty of unconventional and unique blending. Within the rainbow are open paths, open doors, stairways, windows, and horizons symbolizing the idea that "tolerance and diversity open opportunities for everyone. The center court becomes the horizon line for reflecting worlds; one representing a setting sun and the other a full moon on horizon. The ladder, bricks, bridged line, and structure are all symbols that contribute to the idea of prosperity through diversity.)

(Design #2 Homecourt: a full court design that is a blend between an interior domestic scene and a scene from the Port of Oakland. The shape of the house becomes meshed with an image of an iconic Oakland port crane over a sun setting waterfront with shipping containers).



#### Materials and Methods Description

DRYCO will furnish and install all labor, material, equipment and services required to construct the court repairs at the above referenced project and as specified below.

#### 5800 INTERNATIONAL - COURT REPAIRS & RESURFACING

**4" Asphalt Pavement Replacement:** Remove existing asphalt at basketball courts. Play equipment to remain. Off-haul and dispose of debris. Re-compact subbase and place tack oil at any vertical edges. Place and compact 4" of new hot-mix asphalt paving in two separate lifts.

**Re-Surface Basketball Courts:** Thoroughly clean the entire court surface. Apply 1 refinement coat of slurry and sand for proper preparation. Once all preparation work is completed, DRYCO will apply two filler/base coats of full color acrylic mixed with sand to achieve the desired texture for medium play. (Court will be left at black/grey base coat for layout of artist design. Following application of artist design by others, Apply new basketball standard game lines.

#### **Project Backboard Process**

- Project Backboard to draw artwork, created by local artist, on the surface of prepared slab
- Apply sports specific color coating to court with the help of contractor, assistants and community volunteers
- Local contractor to add basketball lines to completed court
- Completed court to have same maintenance requirements and durability as any colored court in park system

#### Community Engagement

- Commission local artist to workshop ideas with community members and create unique work of art for court surface
- Artist to create/allow creation of free court art poster for community members
- Hire local assistants, typically high school or college students, to help draw and paint court art
- Engage volunteers to help paint court art
- Partner with local organizations to celebrate court unveiling

#### **Timeline**

**January/February 2019**: DryCo to remove and replace existing asphalt surface which will be allowed to cure for at least 4 weeks before resurfacing and color coating court.

March/April 2019: Following the completion of DryCo's court construction Project Backbaord will install court artwork with Muzae Sesay.

- 1. *Dryco*: Resurface court and apply first layer of color coating product (6 weeks)
- 2. Draw design on surface of court using grid (1 day)
- 3. Paint artwork on color coating (3-5 days)
- 4. *Dryco*: Stripe court with basketball lines (0.5 1 day)

#### Maintenance Plan
