# Community Wins last year- FY '23-25



- \$216M for record investment in Affordable Housing & Homelessness Solutions
- \$2.85M more for violence prevention, including \$600K focus on sex trafficking
- 911 improvements by prioritizing vacant 911 dispatcher and MACRO positions
- Investigation improvements by hiring 2 civilian police investigators to solve crimes
- \$200K small business Facade Improvement,
  \$200K multilingual business assistance,
  \$300K more for Cultural Affairs grants
- \$10M traffic safety improvements
- Capital and Parks improvements at Lincoln,
  San Antonio, and Clinton Parks in D2, and
  other parks citywide

### Capital Improvement Projects



- Not affected by Mid-cycle Budget Amendments to General Purpose Fund
- District 2 from FY '23-25 Budget:
  - \$29M for Lincoln Rec Center renovation and resiliency hub
  - \$4M for San Antonio Park
    feasibility study for
    Community Library &
    Resilience Center
  - \$2.3M for Fire Station 4 and MACRO headquarters in Central Oakland
- Other projects citywide

#### 2024 Midcycle Budget



- Last year, successfully closed historic \$360M deficit with no layoffs for FY 2023-2025
- Initially anticipated an additional
  \$177M deficit in the General Fund
- \$105M Oakland Coliseum proposed sale to the African
   American Sports and Entertainment Group (would help close current and next year's deficits)
- Identify and collect revenues, improve systems
- "Back to basics" services approach for a clean and safe city



- Continued funding for Permanent Supportive and Affordable Housing through Measure U
- Better addressing the housing continuum, integrating Homelessness Program with Housing and Community Development

#### Community Safety, Prevention, & Healing




- Maintaining Fire Stations and services
- Preserving current service levels ofDepartment of Violence Prevention
- Increased staffing of Oakland
  Ceasefire program focused on violent
  crime
- Preserving MACRO crisis response service levels
- Staffing traffic violence prevention and response and abandoned vehicles
- Police Department staffed priorities for Ceasefire, Crime Reduction Teams (CRTs). Continued foot patrols, 3 police academies

# **Good Jobs and Vibrant Economy**



- \$600K Film Production pilot
- \$150k for construction-related workforce training
- \$150k to build capacity & support contractors of color for more equitable access to city contracts
- Department of Workplace and Employment Standards staffing levels preserved
- Centralizing City Payroll functions
- Increases on-street parking rates from \$2 to \$3 per hour. Rates haven't changed since 2009, CPI has increased by 47%.

#### Clean, Healthy, Sustainable Neighborhoods



- No cuts in services at libraries, senior or recreation centers, or Head Start
- Continues Oakland Fresh pilot for illegal dumping, abandoned autos
- Eliminates year 2 of Council community grants (\$750k)
- Reductions in services from Lake Merritt parking program
