RESOLUTION NO. 89582 C.M.S.

RESOLUTION AWARDING GRANTS TO SEVENTEEN (17) OAKLAND-BASED NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS PROVIDING ARTS AND CULTURAL SERVICES IN OAKLAND FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022-2023 THROUGH “THE CREATIVE ECONOMIES OF BELONGING: JOBS, NETWORK, AND CATALYSTS” GRANT OPPORTUNITY, IN A TOTAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$450,500)

WHEREAS, in 1985, the City Council adopted the first arts funding policies and procedures for the City of Oakland (City), establishing a panel system of evaluating funding proposals and distributing City funds to the arts; and

WHEREAS, the Cultural Funding Program, housed in the Cultural Affairs Division of the Economic and Workforce Development Department, is the City’s funding mechanism to support Oakland-based nonprofit organizations and artists providing arts and cultural activities to the public; and

WHEREAS, through a competitive application process, the National Endowment for the Arts awarded American Rescue Plan funds in the amount of \$500,000 to the City of Oakland Cultural Affairs Division due to its status as a Local Arts Agency and its ability to sub-grant these funds to organizations in Oakland’s cultural sector; and

WHEREAS, on March 15, 2022, Oakland City Council passed Resolution No. 89068 C.M.S., which accepted and appropriated these grants funds from the National Endowment for the Arts to support “The Creative Economies of Belonging: Jobs, Network and Catalysts” grant opportunity for Oakland cultural organizations, and authorized the City Administrator to enter into an agreement with the National Endowment For The Arts to receive said funds; and

WHEREAS, on November 17, 2022, the Cultural Funding Program convened a public review panel and forwarded to the City of Oakland Funding Advisory Committee (FAC) recommendations regarding grants to the specified grantees employing teaching artists and providing arts education programming to the citizens of Oakland; and

WHEREAS, on December 7, 2022, staff presented their recommendations to the FAC for commentary, and the FAC unanimously supported staff’s recommendation to City Council that these Creative Economies of Belonging grants for Fiscal Year 2022-23 Cultural Funding be awarded in the amounts listed in the below table; and

WHEREAS, Fiscal Year 2022-23 funds for the Cultural Funding Program’s Creative Economies of Belonging grant opportunity are available as follows: \$450,500 in Miscellaneous Grants Fund (2999), Cultural Arts and Marketing Organization (85511), Cultural Funding Program (CE02), NEA Cultural Economies Project (1006372); and

WHEREAS, staff recommends that the City Council award grants to specific nonprofit organizations, as set forth in the below table:

FURTHER RESOLVED: That in the event any of the above grants are not encumbered, those funds shall revert to the Cultural Funding Program for use in other categories of support.
