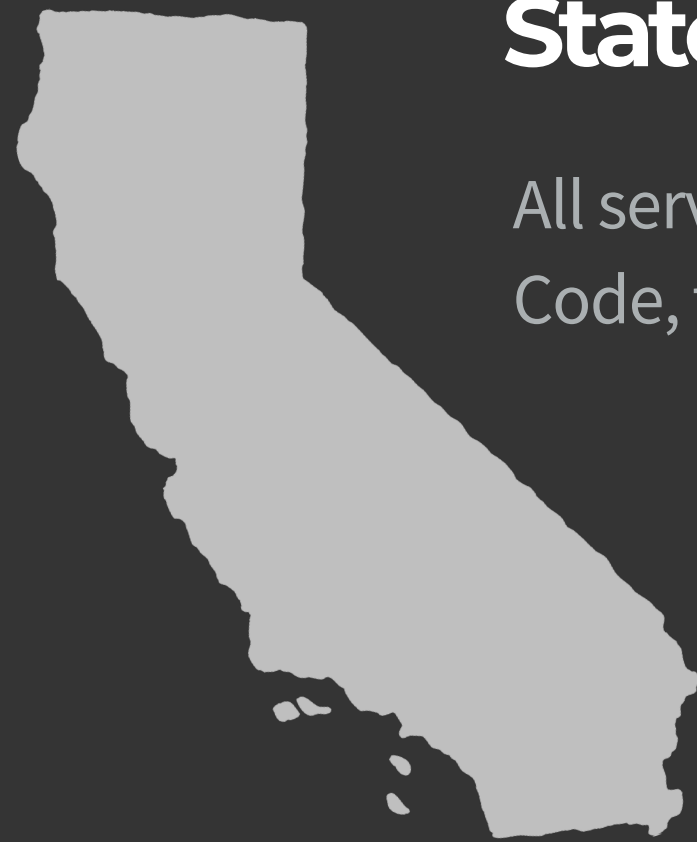

**November 3, 2020**

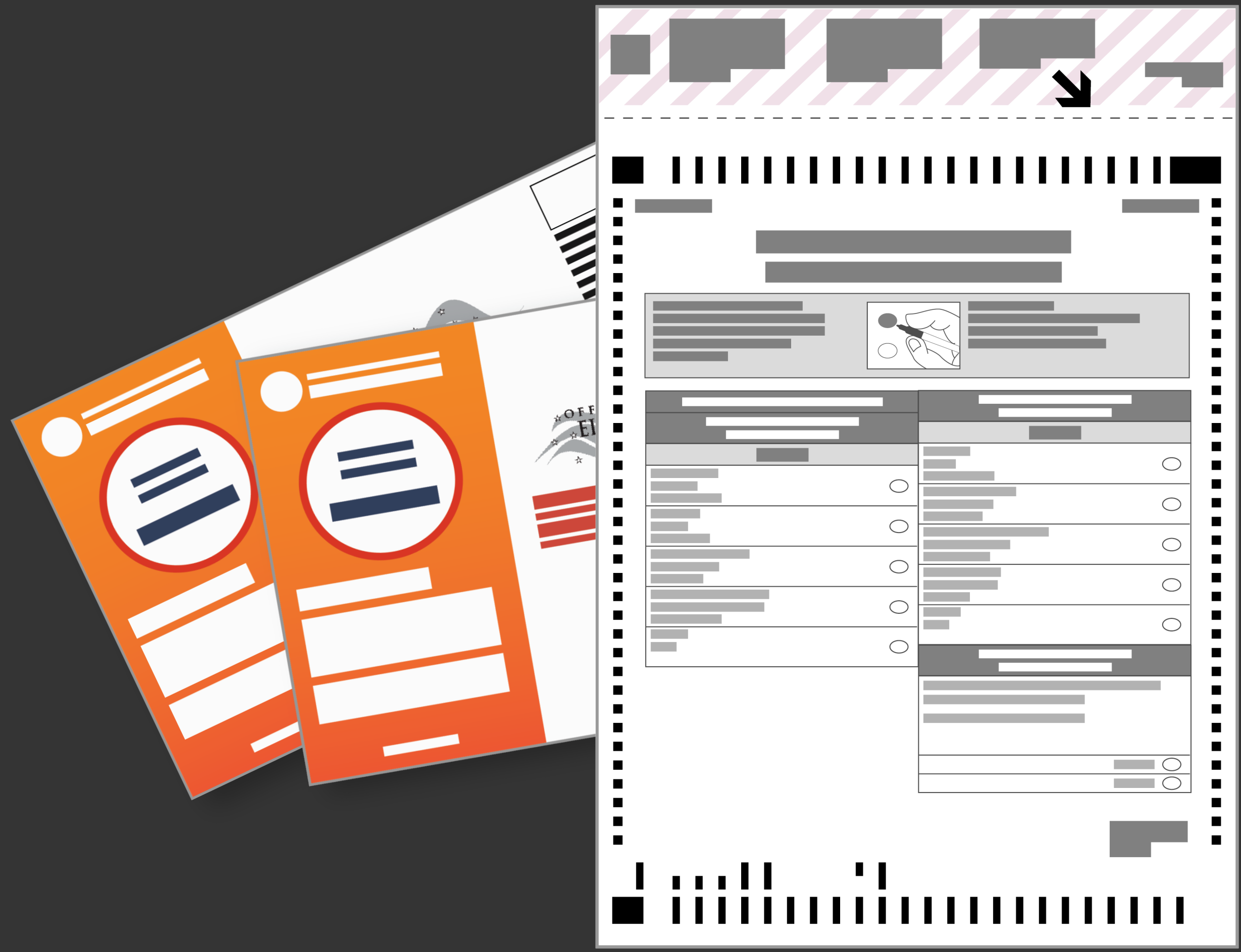

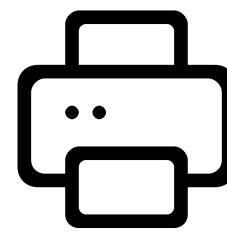

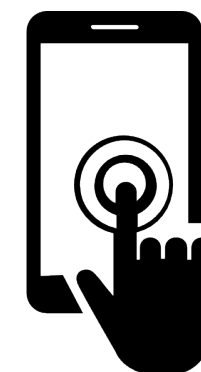

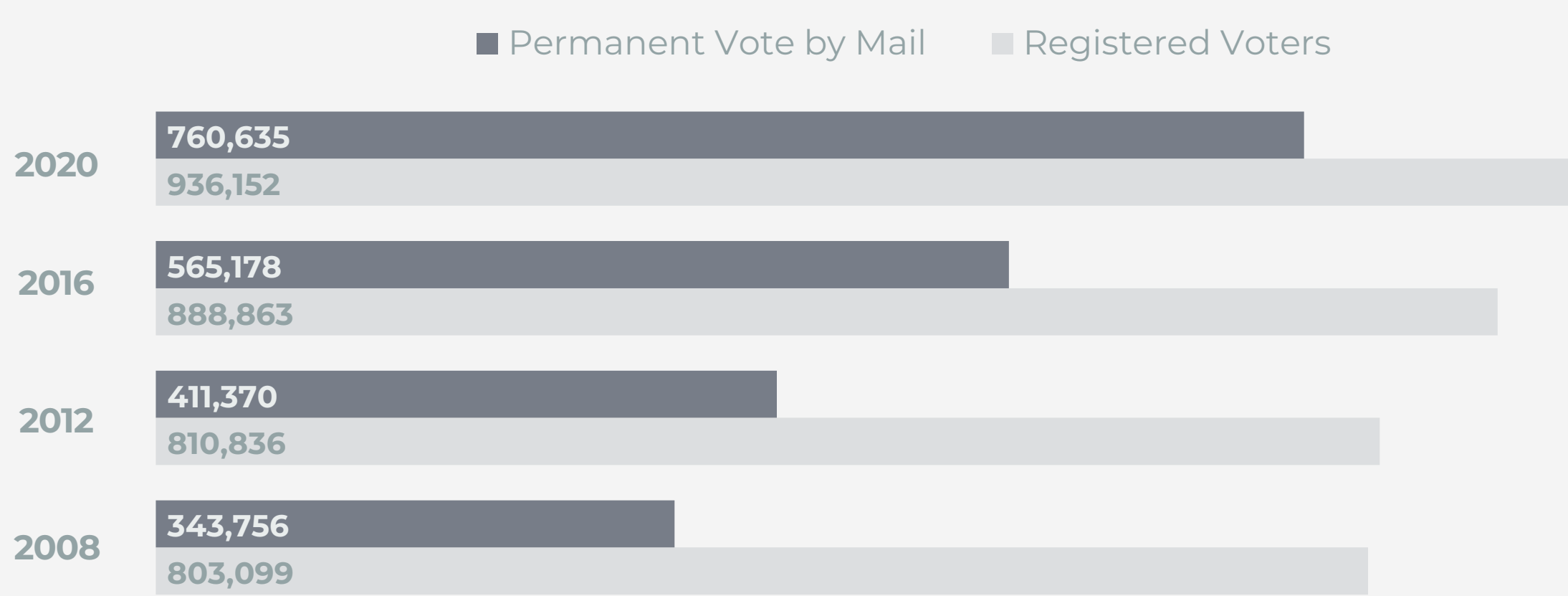
