

BART Construction

There will be continuing BART construction activity on nonconsecutive weekends in the coming months between Rockridge and Orinda. The remaining dates for this are April 15th-16th, May 13th-14th, May 27th-29th and June 10th-11th. On each of these weekends, free buses will replace train service between the stations.

The City of Oakland prefers you to use these contacts in the case of abandoned vehicles (over 311 or 911).

If a vehicle is blocking your driveway and you can't get out, call police non-emergency at (510) 777-3333. An officer will be dispatched to cite and/or tow the vehicle as appropriate.

If a car is parked in your parking stall on private property, talk to your apartment manager or property manager. Oakland Police will not tow in this case.

Public Safety - MACRO

RO (Mobile Assistance Community Responders of Oakland) is Oakland's incident response service where trained civilians respond to calls for service that are believed to be non-violent and not of a serious criminal nature. Responses can include welfare checks on vulnerable community members and, whenever possible, connecting them to services. If you observe individuals who appear to be engaging in problematic behavior that, for example, may indicate a mental health or another medical challenge, or that is a community disturbance such as on-going loud noise, contact <u>macro@oaklandca.gov</u>. that the MACRO team does <u>not</u> address violent situations. Using MACRO for low-level non-violent and non-criminal incidents helps free up OPD officers for more serious matters. Continue to call 911 for serious police matters or any medical emergency.

year judicial officers of the Superior Court are responsible for presenting the names of civic-minded county residents to serve on the Alameda County Civil Grand Jury. The jury's primary responsibility is to examine and report on the operations of local government agencies and to investigate citizen complaints, acting as the public's watchdog. The Grand Jury serves on a fiscal year basis, from July 1 through June 30. Applications are accepted throughout the year and are reviewed each spring for service beginning July 1st. You must be over 18, have lived in Alameda County for at least one year, and possess sufficient knowledge of the English language. Grand Jurors are paid \$15 per day plus mileage.
