

# Deliver safety improvements in 2025 ahead of capital work

- Replace missing or damaged signs
- Refresh or add missing street markings
- Extend Washington St bike lanes from 2<sup>nd</sup> St to Embarcadero West
- Refresh curb zone paint
- Install new stop signs at 2<sup>nd</sup> St intersections

# Status - Intermediate Design (65%)

Improve overweight vehicle railroad at-grade crossing to heavyweight standards

- Safely accommodate Port access for overweight trucks
- Establish new temporary overweight route
- Eliminate current reroute on 7<sup>th</sup> Street sooner than earthquakeresistant bridge redevelopment
- Not intended for public access

#### Overweight Vehicles Since 1993:

- Require permits from City and Port
- Must use designated overweight routes
- Cannot travel on Caltrans highways
  Since 2021:
- Have been temporarily rerouted through West Oakland on 7<sup>th</sup> Street



# Status - Intermediate Design (65%)

Update Market Street railroad at-grade crossing to improve safety and rail operations, including:

- Modernized railroad crossing gate arms for pedestrians and drivers
- High-visibility crosswalks
- Intersection safety lighting
- Intersection re-designed to accommodate large truck turns safely

# Status - Intermediate Design (65%)

Update Oak Street railroad atgrade crossing to improve safety and rail operations, including:

- Modernized railroad crossing gate arms for pedestrians, bicyclists, and drivers
- High-visibility crosswalks
- Intersection safety lighting
- New traffic signal timed to match approaching trains
- Protected bike lane crossing and bike network connections



# MLK Jr. Way - Final Project Scope



- Two-way cycle track
- New street trees, benches, bike parking, and pedestrian lighting
- Upgraded traffic signals and new bike signals
- New ADA curb ramps, bulb-outs, and high-visibility crosswalks
- Wayfinding signage

# **Broadway - Final Project Scope**



- Bus-only lanes and Transit Signal Priority
- New bus shelters with seating, lighting, and trash cans
- New ADA curb ramps, bulb-outs, high-visibility crosswalks, and upgraded sidewalk
- New street trees, benches, bike parking, and lighting
- Upgraded traffic signals
- Wayfinding signage


## **Next Steps**





# **RECAP: Top Themes from Previous Engagement**

- Lighting improvements should be functional, enhance safety, and be easy to maintain.



People had concerns about personal safety and traffic safety when traveling through the undercrossings.



There's strong interest in art and creating vibrant spaces that represents Oakland's history and culture.



Maintenance was a concern. Undercrossings should be clean, and trash should be removed regularly. New improvements should be easy to maintain.



There was support for adding bright, bold colors. There were suggestions to use color on the ceilings, columns, and walkways to brighten the undercrossings.
















