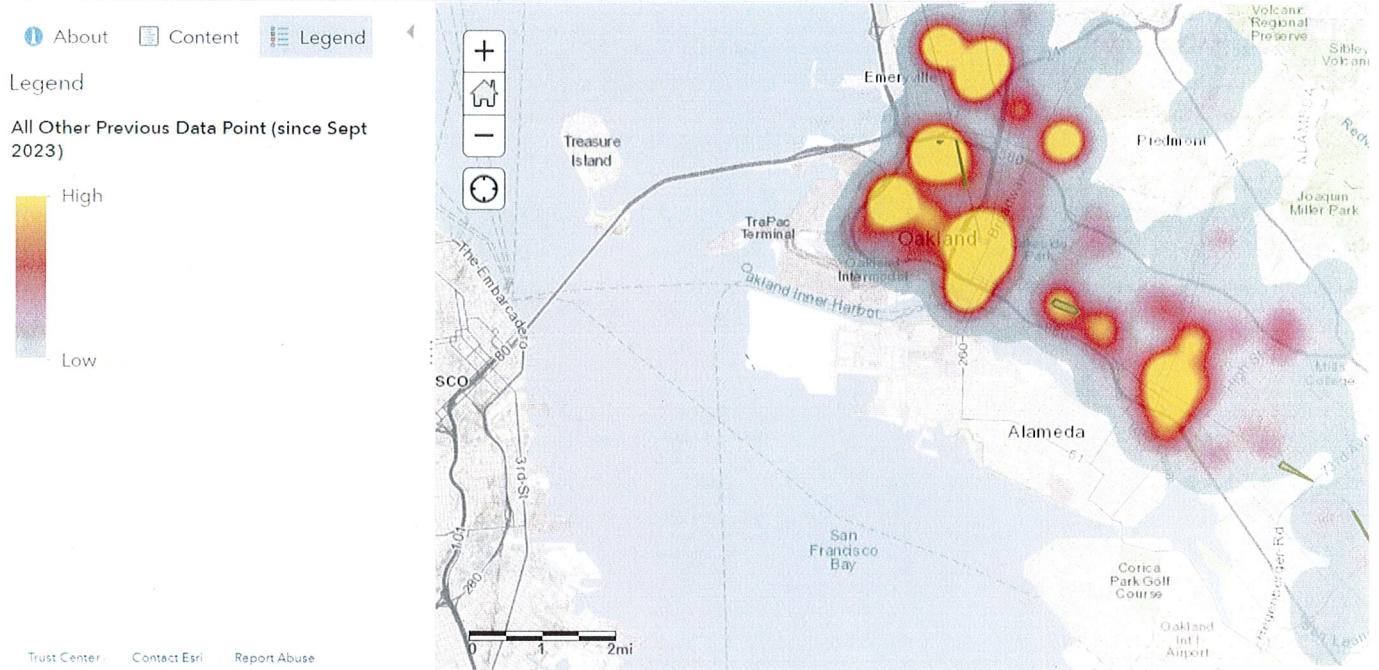

Budget

- 2 Supervisor- 1 out on medical
- 2 PST- 1 staff on light duty

3 vacant positions- In the hiring process. HR has completed a hiring list and will send out written exam next week. HR has not confirmed how many positions will be filled.

Key Projects

National Night Out was a success. We had 440 parties City-wide. 240 volunteers visiting parties.
Clean and Safe City- Promoted to NCs and conducted outreach City-wide.
Creek to Bay- Promoted to NCs and NW.
