Community Policing Advisory Board Committees

It is the policy of the Advisory Board to appoint individual Advisory Board members to perform specific tasks or functions. The Chairperson is authorized to form standing committees to carry out the responsibilities of the Advisory Board. The Chairperson shall appoint Advisory Board members to serve as committee chairperson for a period of one (1) year.

The following outlines committees as established in the bylaws:

Fund Development Committee

This committee shall be responsible for identifying and seeking financial support for the Advisory Board. This committee shall monitor Neighborhood Councils funds if provided in the City budget.

Recommended initial tasks: Status of FY 2024-2025 Neighborhood Council funds

Program and Services Committee

This committee shall recommend program activities, including outreach and training, media relations and providing services to the Neighborhood Councils.

Recommended initial tasks: Plan & schedule CPAB Retreat.

Neighborhood Council Resource Committee

This committee shall serve as the primary liaison to the Neighborhood Councils, certify Neighborhood Councils, and mediate disputes relating to Neighborhood Councils compliance with Resolution 79235.

Recommended initial tasks: Outline a plan for recertification and dispute resolution.

Committees shall meet at the call of their Chairperson, or as deemed necessary by a majority of the committee membership.

Committees shall regularly provide a one-page written document with meeting dates, agenda items, actions, recommendations, and pertinent information to the Chairperson.
