# Commissioner Goode's suggested changes to Draft Map F3 and rationale

My single, on-time map submission:

Title F3-E5-F6-G7 Latina POP and CVAP

### **Approach**

I started mapping in G7, then worked in F6, and E5. Working in the flats first, in East Oakland, allows for focus on the major structural changes needed to keep the Coliseum and adjacent neighborhoods in G7 and to maximize the Latina CVAP in E5. There are minor shifts in other population and CVAP numbers (note: DistrictR does not provide Other/White CVAP data).

### Results

**Ideal Population = 62,949** (this is the total population of Oakland divided by 7)

**Total Deviation = 5%** (this formula is my own calculation, based on the info given to us by RP, which is the difference between the largest, positive deviation in a district and the largest, negative deviation)

G7: Coliseum is in G7 with adjacent neighborhoods

G7: Oak Knoll, King Estate Park and the Seneca reservoir are moved to F6

F6: Maxwell Park is back in F6 (it was in E5 in Map F3)

F6: the southern border extends to the waterfront

E5: Latina population is 50% and CVAP is 30.4%

E5: Bridges Academy is in E5

E5: the western border moves to 19th Ave & Foothill then over to 23rd Ave above Foothill Blvd

E5: 23rd Ave below foothill blvd is in one district and not used as the district border

The **bold** numbers indicate majority or plurality. The numbers formatted in **purple** indicate an increase from map F3.
