### (RESUME ASKING ALL RESPONDENTS)

AS YOU MAY KNOW, 38 PERCENT OF THE CITY'S BUDGET GENERAL FUND IS ALLOCATED TO POLICE SERVICES. HOWEVER, THERE ARE MANY POTENTIAL BUDGET ITEMS THAT CAN HAVE AN IMPACT ON COMMUNITY SAFETY AND IN 2020, THE CITY COUNCIL CREATED A TASK FORCE TO REIMAGINE OAKLAND'S PUBLIC SAFETY SYSTEM. THE GOALS WERE TO INCREASE COMMUNITY SAFETY THROUGH ALTERNATIVE RESPONSES TO CALLS FOR ASSISTANCE, AND INVESTMENTS IN PROGRAMS THAT ADDRESS THE ROOT CAUSES OF VIOLENCE AND CRIME ALONG WITH THE GOAL OF REDUCING THE OAKLAND POLICE DEPARTMENT BUDGET ALLOCATION. THE TASK FORCE CAME UP WITH 151 RECOMMENDATIONS AND WE'D LIKE TO ASK YOU ABOUT SOME OF THE HIGHER PRIORITY RECOMMENDATIONS THAT WOULD HAVE BUDGET IMPLICATIONS.
