# **INFORMATION**

This memo is to provide the Oakland City Council, the Mayor's Office, City staff and the community with an update regarding progress in implementing the 2019 3-Year Paving Plan through the latest six months of the plan timeline (July 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020).

## **GENERAL OVERVIEW**

On May 7, 2019, City Council adopted a Resolution No. 87673 C.M.S., establishing the 2019 3-Year Paving Plan (3YP), a more than \$100M plan to repair Oakland's streets. This plan was funded with the adoption of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2019-21 Capital Improvement Plan in June 2019, and officially kicked off with the new fiscal year on July 1, 2019. The 3YP represents an aggressive step towards investing in Oakland streets, including tripling annual spending on repaving from recent averages. The plan's investments will keep the majority of Oakland's major streets in good to excellent condition and massively invest in residential streets.

#### **SUMMARY OF PROGRESS**

The proposed 2019 3YP prioritized repaving on more than 130 miles of streets and established a budget of \$128M, with \$102M toward construction. As of December 2020, approximately 33% of the plan has been paved (**Table 1**).

Constructing curb ramps is a key part of the City of Oakland's paving program. To date, the City has constructed 842 curb ramps as part of the 3YP, supporting accessibility and walkability on each street that is repaved as part of the 2019 3-Year Plan (**Table 2**).

The paving program is also charged with implementing citywide systemic safety upgrades, such as converting all existing marked crosswalks to "high visibility" style markings. High visibility crosswalks improve driver yielding, improving pedestrian safety. To date, the program has completed 1,150 crosswalk improvements. In the past six months, 51 of these crosswalk improvements have been next to schools, such as United for Success Academy located near Galindo Street.

The program also addresses sidewalk damage that is City responsibility along project corridors and it facilitates repair of damage that is private owner responsibility to repair. To date, more than 37,300 square feet of sidewalks have been repaired through the paving program (**Table 2**). Of this, 18 locations have been repaired through OakDOT's Low-Income Property Owner Repair program, which repairs sidewalks for low-income property owners at no cost.

Finally, nearly 10 miles of new bikeways recommended in Let's Bike Oakland, the City's 2019 bicycle plan update, have been implemented to date as part of the 3YP (**Table 2**). In the past six months, new bike lanes were added on Camden Street between Seminary Avenue and Brann Street and new neighborhood bikeways were marked on D Street between 82nd Ave and 92nd Ave, and Hillside Street between 73rd Ave and 82nd Ave.

## PROGRESS BY LOCATION

In the first 18 months of the plan, the largest number of paved miles were located in the Central East Oakland planning area (**Table 3**). In the past six months, mileage has included corridorlength repaving on streets such as Camden Street between Seminary Avenue and Foothill Boulevard and D Street between 82nd Avenue and 92nd Avenue.

## **STAFFING OF PAVING PROGRAM**

OakDOT's paving program includes a variety of staff positions including planning and program analysis, engineering, field operations, and supervisory staff. Paving projects begin with planning and design in OakDOT's Complete Streets Paving team within OakDOT's Great Streets Delivery Division. From there, projects are coordinated with OakDOT's Great Streets Maintenance Division for in-house construction or coordinated with OPW's Construction Management Division for contract construction. Currently, there are multiple vacancies within each section, including two engineers in paving design; three concrete finishers in concrete maintenance; and approximately half of the positions budgeted in OPW's Construction Management division. All positions are funded at least in part by Measure KK.

# **COMPLETION OF 3YP AND MEASURE KK**

The completion of the 3YP is dependent upon the availability of Measure KK funds. Staff is working closely with the Finance Department regarding timing of bond funds and will update the public if changes are made to the delivery of this program.

Information, webmaps, and reports related to the paving program and the 3YP are maintained on the City's website.<sup>5</sup> Staff maintain multiple webmaps on the program website that provide information such as a 3YP overview and anticipated paving schedule by year. The program website is also the electronic home for these bi-annual reports.
