#### **SUMMARY**

Since the last Quarterly Code Enforcement Report of May 2020, the Planning and Building Department's Code Enforcement unit experienced a 29 percent increase in complaints: from 1,151 reported in Quarter 3 (January – March 2020) to 1,491 in Quarter 4 (April – June 2020). Concurrently, a decrease in inspections from 3,868 for Quarter 3 to 1,249 for Quarter 4 occurred during this same reporting period, resulting from new inspection-procedure changes to meet COVID-19 social distancing safety requirements, which took time for transition to implement. During this period, due to conditions related to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Alameda County Shelter-in-Place Order, and two Code Enforcement inspector retirements, Code Enforcement inspection response was impacted.

Below are key initiatives that the Planning and Building Department (PBD) continues to address since the last Quarterly Report. PBD plans to schedule an informational report covering Fiscal Year 2020-21 Quarters 1-3 for discussion at a Community & Economic Development (CED) Committee or City Council meeting prior to the 2021 Summer Recess.

#### **Staff Coordination**

PBD developed strategic solutions for response to field complaints while complying with the regulations detailed in the Alameda County Shelter-in-Place Order. These efforts have provided a means to respond to complaints in a safe manner with required personal protective equipment (PPE) and social distancing. Ongoing training for City Code Enforcement staff continues to be provided. Internal training opportunities have allowed for Code Enforcement Inspectors to participate in training alongside Permit Inspection staff for an array of training topics that include technical assessments, inspection procedures, and customer service. Additionally, bi-weekly meetings continue to occur with other City departments, including the Fire Prevention Office of the Fire Department, the City Attorney's Office, and the Housing and Community Development Department to address effective and timely responses for complex cases.

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#### **Proactive Rental Inspection Program (PRIP)**

PBD continues to work on the Project Plan for the implementation of the City of Oakland's Proactive Rental Inspection Program (PRIP). In preparation for this program, PBD is undertaking through its FUSE Fellow a Racial Equity Analysis with support from the Race and Equity Department that will effectively serve to produce PRIP Inspections that provide equitable outcomes for the City's diverse communities while meeting this critical need for habitability.

#### **Recruitments**

During this quarter, Code Enforcement staff completed reference checks for Specialty Combination Inspector candidates resulting from interviews.






## Volume of 1<sup>st</sup> Inspections Since FY2018 Quarter 1 – FY2020 Quarter 4
