

Current Campus Operations



There are 9 non-profit organizations with space currently on the campus in the buildings not being used by Nestle, in operation from 3 years to a few months.



There is a small weekly Maj Jongg group, monthly board meetings, a casual monthly lunch with the organizations on campus, and tours of the site with donors.



There are 6 retail tenants, and all tenant spaces will remain.



Nestle will move out in December 2024.



The JCC East Bay has 43 years of experience running programs and events in a highly residential neighborhood in Berkeley where we do not receive complaints.

Planned Campus Operations

We plan to have:

- 15-20 Jewish nonprofit organizations with service and office space.
- Preschool for up to 120 kids, including a Spanish-immersion pilot.
- Gathering space for community celebrations, arts & culture, holidays, and refuge.
- Outdoor gathering spaces for work, meeting, and recreation.
- A Teen Center, artist-in-residence studio space, and a makerspace.
- Family engagement activities.
- Health and wellness activities and adult education classes.
- A small cafe to serve the internal campus and a commercial kosher kitchen.
- Continued commercial retail on College Avenue.
- Possible Afterschool and Summer Camp.

Rockridge Community Survey Results




Campus activities folks want to participate in:






Design Considerations

- Address safety for vehicles, bicycles, and pedestrians adjacent to campus.
- Provide outdoor activity space while mitigating noise off campus.
- Add more porous surfaces, plant life, and green spaces.



















