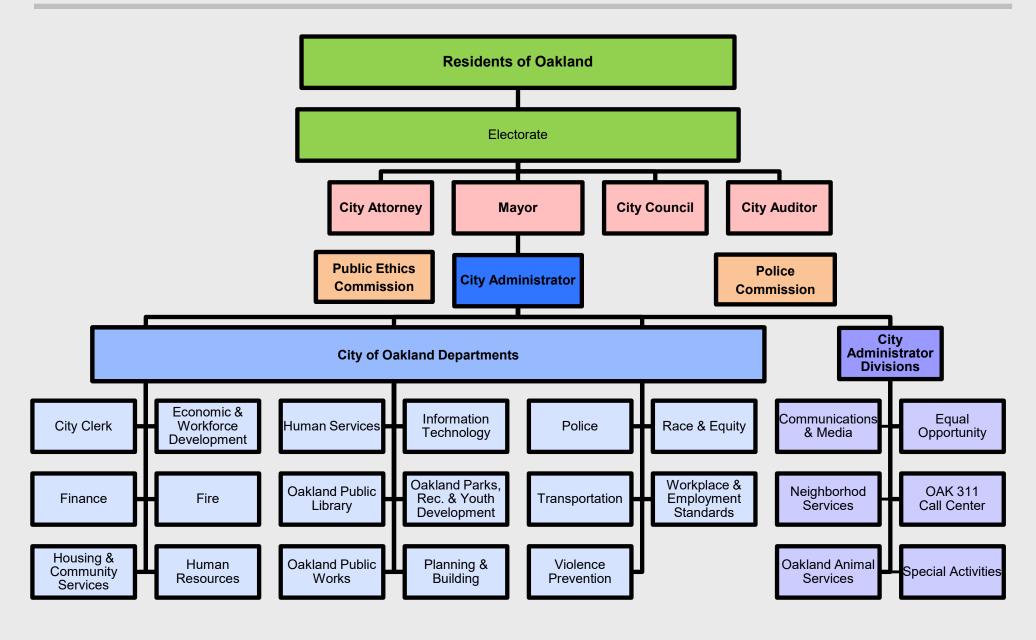

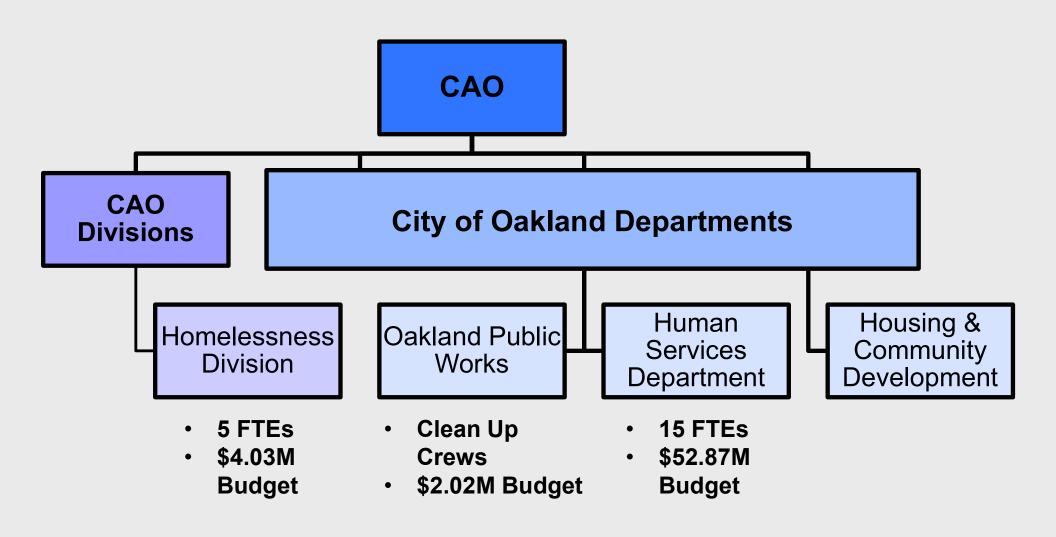

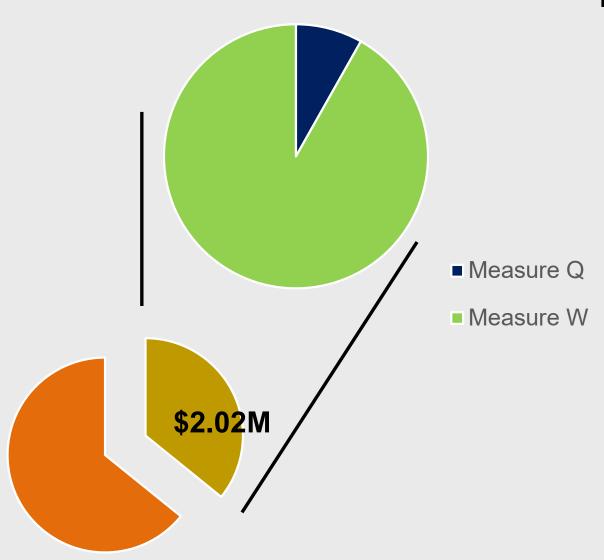
CITY DEPTS FOCUSED ON HOMELESSNESS





OPW Encampment Services Budget FY21-22





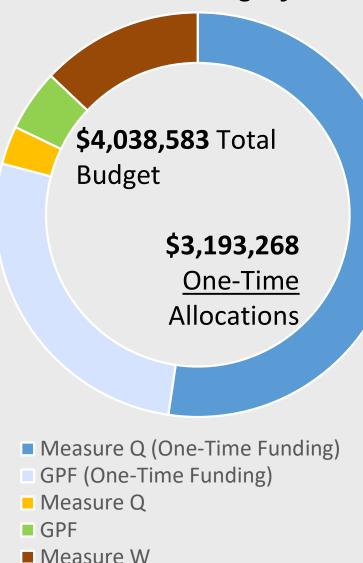
FY 21-22 Biennial Budget

- OPW Illegal Dumping crews were funded to in-part do encampment services through
 \$2.02M in budgeted time.
- This amounts to 36% of the total Illegal Dumping Budget



CAO Homelessness Division Budget FY21-22

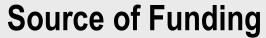
Use of Funding by Fund

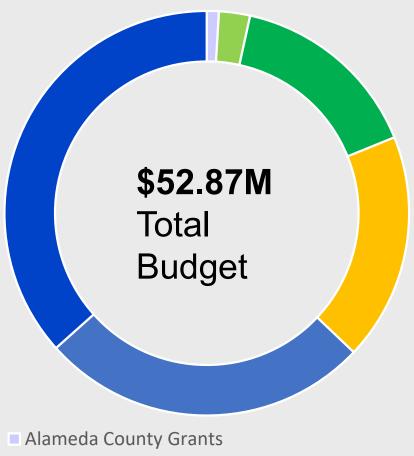


FY 21-22 Biennial Budget

- Created CAO Division
- Added 3 FTEs to existing 2 FTEs for total of 5 FTEs
- Uses primarily City funding to support programming
- One-time funding is mostly for contracting for encampment services

FY 21-22 Biennial Budget + HHAP Round 2

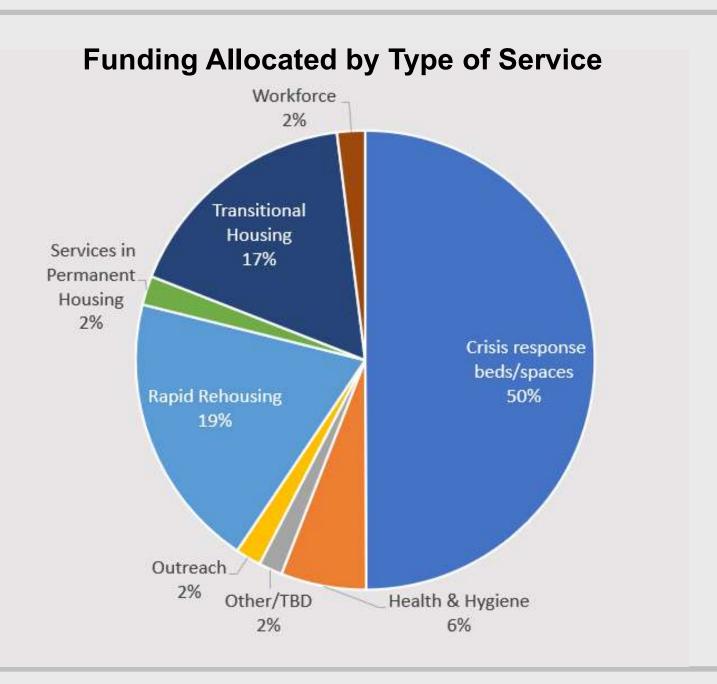
- Added 2 FTEs to do encampment services management
- Included both ongoing source as well as, prior year and one-time awards
- 63% funding: federal government
- 18% funding: state grants
- 19% funding: local revenue
- 15 FTEs

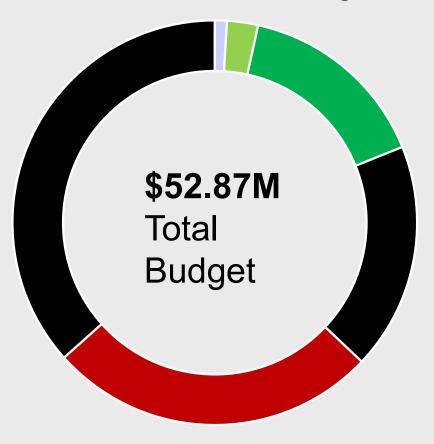

This leaves us with State HHAP Funds – these are technically one-time multi-year allocations, which hampers long-term planning, this funding is need to sustain existing interventions.

FY 21-22 Operating Budget Facts

- 63% funding: federal government
- 18% funding: state grants
- 19% funding: local revenue



The City lacks committed ongoing resources for current services after FY 2022-23, because:

- State HHAP funding is not guaranteed
- One-time Federal Emergency COVID funding is being fully spent
