Adopt-a-Drain Before the Rain

You can help reduce flooding and keep trash out of our waterways by adopting a storm drain and keeping it clear of debris. The City of Oakland's Environmental Stewardship Team provides tools, supplies, and debris pick-up for Adopt-a-Drain volunteers. Report & Prevent Local Flooding to Protect our Properties

More than 300 miles of pipes below Oakland's streets carry stormwater into waterways that flow into the San Francisco Bay. When working well, this system is barely noticeable. However, much of the City's pipes and supporting infrastructure were built decades ago and in some areas the system is near the end of its useful life. In addition, development of vacant land over time has increased the amount and intensity of storm water runoff during storms and some areas of the system can be overwhelmed by heavy rains. The Storm Drainage Master Plan will help the City prioritize storm drainage infrastructure rehabilitation and improvement and will identify projects designed to prevent or reduce local flooding at "stormwater hotspots." Clean Water Program: Grants to Help Protect Waterways

The Alameda Countywide Clean Water Program is offering grants **up to \$6,000 each** for community-based projects that prevent stormwater pollution and enhance the health of local watersheds, creeks, and the San Francisco Bay. Eligible projects include cleanups, outreach and education, creek restoration, public art, litter reduction. The deadline for submissions is **May 10, 2024, 5PM**. 2024 Spring Stream Team - Paid environmental internship for OUSD high school students

The 2024 Spring Stream Team is a paid environmental training partnership between the <u>Youth Employment</u> <u>Partnership</u> (YEP) and <u>Friends of Sausal Creek</u> (FOSC). Transportation



West Oakland's Universal Basic Mobility Pilot

Building on the success of the East Oakland Universal Basic Mobility Pilot, the <u>West</u> <u>Oakland Universal Basic Mobility Pilot</u> continues the transformation of public transit in Oakland. Thanks to a generous grant from the Alameda County Transportation Commission, up to 1,000 income-qualifying residents can receive a \$320 benefit for public transit and shared mobility services. If you live or work in West Oakland and qualify as "Low" or "Moderate" Income, you're eligible to participate. Keep an eye out for sign-up opportunities opening in early 2024!

Clean Cars for All Program

The Bay Area Air Quality Management District's <u>Clean Cars for All Program</u> is now open and has expanded to the entire Bay Area (within the Air District's jurisdiction). Income-eligible Bay Area residents can receive grants **up to \$12,000** to trade in their old vehicle (model year 2007 or older) and purchase or lease a cleaner vehicle or get a pre-paid card for public transit or an e-bike. Eligibility is based on income, the vehicle to be retired, and other requirements. **Visit the <u>Clean Cars for All</u>** website to learn more and apply.

Induction Cooktop Lending Program and Rebates

Induction is the safest and most energy-efficient cooking technology available today. The difference is in the technology. See for yourself!

- Ava: <u>Reserve your Induction Lending Kit today</u>, including a portable cooktop and compatible pan, operating instructions, and recipes. The loan period is 21 days. The induction Cooktop lending Program is available to all residential electricity customers residing in the East Bay-- Ava customers as well as noncustomers who receive service from PG&E.
- **PG&E**: PG&E's Induction Cooktop Loaner Program offers plug-in countertop induction units for two-weeks, at no cost, to all residents. To borrow and learn more about induction cooking, visit <u>pge.com/inductionloaner</u> where you can start the loan process. PG&E will provide shipping details and cover shipping costs.

Ava is also offering **up to \$250** per eligible residential customer for an induction cooktop/range, when you replace an existing gas appliance. Recycling Team Audits Trash, Recycle and Compost Containers

The City of Oakland Recycling Team staff, Climate Action Corps Fellows, and hired consultants conducted visual audits of 2% of Oakland residents' and businesses' trash, compost and recycle containers March 3 – March 15. California's <u>Senate Bill</u> <u>1383</u>, Short-Lived Climate Pollutant Reduction Act, requires all CA cities to conduct these annual field audits to understand how residents are sorting their waste. This information will be used to better educate people on what goes into each container. StopWaste: "DeliverZero" Ambassador Program

Reusable foodware service provider DeliverZero is bringing their take-out foodware system to Alameda County, supported by a StopWaste grant for reusable foodware infrastructure. Their innovative ambassador program invites residents to get involved in recruiting restaurants and other food businesses to sign up for DeliverZero's services.
