  - On Monday, October 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2023, at possibly an hour prior to 8:17 PM, a Black male bicyclist approximately 50-59 years old was severely injured by a driver in a hit-and-run collision along the 550 block of 45<sup>th</sup> Street.
  - On Wednesday, October 25<sup>th</sup>, 2023 at approximately 10:26 PM, a Hispanic male pedestrian approximately 40 years old was killed by a driver in a hit-and-run collision at the 4200 block of International Boulevard at High Street, involving the following scenario: a driver ("Driver #1") traveling eastbound in the 4200 block of International Blvd at a high rate of speed collided with another driver's (Driver #2") vehicle. The impact from the collision caused Driver #1 to collide into two parked vehicles on the south curbside, where the pedestrian was pinned in between the two parked vehicles. The pedestrian suffered a severed leg and was transported to the hospital, where he later succumbed to his injuries.

Meeting called to order at 6:04 PM by BPAC Chair Dianne Yee.

#### Item 1. Roll Call/Determination of Quorum/Introductions

At roll call, quorum was established with 7 Commissioners present (X). One Commissioner was excused.

#### Item 2. Open Forum / Public Comment

- Rachel Osajima lived near the Bruns Court Overcrossing as a child and used it hundreds of times. She claims that there are issues with the related Caltrans Project study, and she requests additional solutions to keep an overcrossing at the Bruns Court location. She requests that the topic be added to an upcoming BPAC agenda. She is also concerned about the loss of motor vehicle parking in the area for ADA access.
- Kevin Dalley stated that the 2016-2018 study by the City of Oakland on Park Boulevard suggests that the roadway should not be reduced to one motor vehicle lane in each direction. There is new information to suggest that the roadway can indeed be reduced to one lane in each direction.

#### Item 3. Approval of Meeting Minutes

→ A motion to adopt the Bicyclist & Pedestrian Advisory Commission meeting minutes from September 21<sup>st</sup>, 2023 was made (Yee), seconded (Campbell), and approved by roll call vote. Commissioners Ralston and Whipps abstained from the vote.

#### Item 4. Recent Bicyclist and Pedestrian Fatal Traffic Crashes

Commissioner SchaderChair Yee (patricias.oakland@gmail.comyee.bpac@gmail.com) led the commission in a discussion of recent fatal and other high-profile traffic crashes in Oakland involving bicyclists and pedestrians.

The list of recent crashes was included in the meeting's agenda packet.

Summary of Discussion:

- George Spies shared on behalf of Traffic Violence Rapid Response (TVRR) that there were at least five traffic fatalities in Oakland the week of September 26<sup>th</sup>. He and Bryan Culbertson visited 3 of the locations, including the site of the pedestrian death on Seminary Avenue, and met the family of the victim while they were setting up a roadside memorial for the victim. TVRR may announce a vigil event for the victim.
- Quick-builds should be considered at sites like the one on Seminary Avenue. There have been at least two fatal collisions near this location in the past year.
- Commissioner Mangrum rides a bicycle on International Blvd all the time, and has experienced a number of near-misses with drivers.
- International Boulevard appears dangerous for the most vulnerable pedestrians (I.e., children and seniors), according to collision data.

#### Item 5. BPAC Commissioner Recommendations

The Recruitment Committee reported back with recommendations from its review of applications of people seeking to be appointed to the BPAC for three-year terms beginning January 2024. The Committee recommended Enjoleah Daye, Cynthia Citlalli Herrera, and David Ralston (reappointment). Commissioners are appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by City Council.

- → A motion to accept the Recruitment Committee's recommendations to appoint as Commissioners Enjoleah Daye, Cynthia Citlalli Herrera, and David Ralston (reappointment) was made (Yee), seconded (Whipps), and unanimously approved by roll call vote. Commissioner Ralston abstained.
- Staff will forward the recommendations to the Mayor's Office.

#### Item 6. Vision 980 Study

Becky Frank and Hunter Oatman-Stanford, transportation planners from the Office of Regional and Community Planning at Caltrans District 4, introduced Caltrans' Vision 980 Study. <u>Email Caltrans staff about</u> the project at vision980@dot.ca.gov.

Summary of Discussion:

- Phase 1 of the study is planned to begin in 2024, and to conclude in Summer 2025.
- Phase 2 to conclude by Summer 202<u>76</u>. City of Oakland was a co-applicant for Phase 2 and will share that Phase with Caltrans.
- Other City of Oakland studies, plans, and projects have included comments on Highway 980, so the Vision 980 study should reference those comments.
- Elaine Brown's 1992 memoir, A Taste of Power, includes context on the Black Panthers' lobbying in the 1970s to finish construction of Highway 980 to increase vehicular access to jobs in Oakland's City center.
- An Interstate 580 Transit and Multimodal Strategy study by the Alameda County Transportation Commission (ACTC) will examine the extent to which freight trucks need to use I-580, and a Request for Proposals is about to be released for that study (and will be conducted on a shorter timeline than the Vision 980 Study).
- There may be some misinformation in local and/or mass media about what this study is.
- Interstate 980 should be compared to Interstate 880 in terms of racial disparities.
- Caltrans has proposed a number of community meetings and will include community-based organizations in its outreach efforts.
- Is social media a valid source of public comment on this project? Consider Nextdoor, Facebook, Instagram as tools of an engagement model that may benefit harder-to-reach communities.
- While a limited number of conceptual visualizations will be created for this study, there is no limit to the number of options for the future of Highway 980. The hope is that the local community will coalesce around one vision for the Highway.
- Repaving work on Oakland's streets should not be affected by the study.
- How will the decision-making process look like at the end of the public input process? In the case that it is recommended that the Interstate highway be removed, State legislative action and collaboration between Caltrans and the City of Oakland would be required.

#### Item 7. Safe Routes to BART Application for Lakeside Drive Cycle Track Project

Craig Raphael, Senior Transportation Planner with OakDOT's Capital Finance team (<u>CRaphael@oaklandca.gov</u>), provided an overview of and requested a BPAC letter of support for an upcoming application to the Safe Routes to BART construction grant program for a cycle track at Lakeside Drive <u>and Lake Merritt Boulevard</u> between International Boulevard and 19th Street. Craig answered questions about the City of Oakland's involvement in the Safe Routes to BART program to date. Summary of Discussion:

- The name of the grant application and project is the Lake Merritt Bikeway.
- This funding round is the third, after two unsuccessful applications by the City of Oakland to receive funding for this project via the Safe Routes to BART grant program.
- This \$10 million project, at 100% design, would create a separated bike lane around the southern part of Lake Merritt.
- This separated bike lane would enhance connections between up to three BART Stations: 19<sup>th</sup> Street, 12<sup>th</sup> Street, and Lake Merritt Stations.
- The Franklin Street separated bike lane project may be more expensive, closer to the order of 20 million to 30 million dollars.
- Lakeshore Avenue between El Embarcadero and E 18<sup>th</sup> Street has been discussed, but OakDOT does not have any details yet to share about plans for that roadway. Another project would need to be proposed for this extent.
- Socioeconomic and high-injury location data should be highlighted in the grant application.
- If the grant application is successful, construction is anticipated to begin in Winter 2024/25, spanning one to two years.
- Connecting Eastlake with Downtown Oakland via this separated bike lane is important.
- → A motion to submit a letter of support for the Safe Routes to BART Lake Merritt Bikeway project grant application was made (Ralston), seconded (Frank), and unanimously approved by roll call vote.



On October 25<sup>th</sup>, 2023, at approximately 2226 hours, Oakland Police officers were dispatched to High St & International Blvd to investigate a report of a hit and run collision with major injuries. Upon officers' arrival, officers located a victim whose leg was completely severed from the collision. Emergency medical personnel responded and transported the victim to Alameda County Hospital (ACH) where he later succumbed to his injuries.

The deceased victim, a male Hispanic, was approximately 40 years old. His identity is being withheld pending notification of next of kin.

Upon further investigation, it was determined that a Kia Sorento SUV (stolen vehicle) was traveling EB in the 4200 block of International at a high rate of speed when it collided with a Pontiac Vibe. The Pontiac Vibe fled the scene and self-transported to ACH with minor injuries. The impact from the collision caused the Kia Sorento to collide into two parked vehicles (a Ford Mustang and a Chrysler Pacifica), parked on the south curbside. The deceased victim was pinned in between the two parked vehicles.

The driver from the stolen Kia Sorento fled the scene.

It is unknown if Alcohol or drugs played a factor in this collision.

On October 23rd, 2023, at about 2017 hrs, Oakland Police officers were dispatched to the 550 blk of 45<sup>th</sup> St to investigate a report of a hit and run collision. OFD arrived on scene prior to officer arrival and located a male (V1), laying on the ground bleeding from the head. OFD also observed a bicycle with major damage near V1. An unknown citizen advised OFD that V1 had been struck by a vehicle.

Upon arrival, Officers realized that the accident occurred underneath the overpass where there are many unsheltered individuals that live there. They stated the bicyclist had been struck by an unknown vehicle possibly an hour prior to medical services being called.

The driver of the vehicle fled the scene after the collision in an unknown direction. The bicycle was taken away from the scene prior to officer arrival by an unknown person and no other witnesses were located.

The bicyclist is a male Black appearing to be in his 50's. V1 is listed a John Doe at this moment pending ID. He is in critical condition with major head and spine trauma.

It is unknown if Alcohol or drugs played a factor in this collision.
