AQUATICS

OPRYD Aquatics team members are committed to providing pool access citywide while following current health guidelines. The Covid-19 pandemic had a negative impact on the availability of OPRYD certified aquatics staff. As we add additional certified lifeguards, program hours, days, and times are subject to change. Please scroll down for information on future lifeguard certification classes and employment opportunities.

Lions Pool: Lions Pool currently offers year-round programming including Lap Swim and Fall Family/Recreation Swim. Lions Pools is expected to resume pre-pandemic programming including youth learn-to-swim lessons, junior lifeguards, youth competitive swim team, adult swim lessons, and Parent & Child Swim Lessons for ages 6 months to 3 years-old. As of October 11, 2021, the Oakland Undercurrents, an Oakland-based non-profit, began its swimming program. Classes are offered Monday-Wednesday from 4:00pm-5:45pm.

The East Oakland Sports Center Pool closed on Wednesday November 23, 2021, due to a pool circulation pump that failed along with a burst in a dehumidifier pipe that caused flooding in the pump room and Men's locker room. ABM Facility Services reported that the dehumidifier pipes are scheduled to be replaced on Friday December 3, 2021. This will allow EOSC to reopen on Monday December 6, 2021.

Water Aerobics classes are held Monday-Friday mornings from 8:30am-9:30am and Monday and Thursday evening from 5:30pm-6:30pm. Sign up is not necessary. Just come on in and join us! We ask attendees to be prompt for class as the instructor reserves the leave after the first 15 minutes if there are no attendees. Masks are required. Appropriate attire for the class consists of fitness or comfortable clothing and sneakers.

In partnership with the City of Oakland's Department of Human Services (DHS), Watercolor classes are offered via Zoom to all 4 senior centers including one citywide Spanish version. Plans for a second collaboration via Zoom is in the works for a beginning dance class for seniors. Date to be determined.

Discovery Center: As of October 1, 2021, the Discovery Center transitioned to its secondary location at Arroyo Viejo Recreation Center. The primary location is undergoing a deep cleaning and will be open on a limited basis. Science curriculum has been created and distributed for Town Afterschool Program locations.

Community Gardens: There are 12 active community gardens, 12 registered gardeners, and 247 thriving planting boxes. Staff are actively recruiting community gardeners to utilize unused boxes and to reactivate dormant gardens. Staff regularly manage gardens, and report vandalism and public safety issues. Meetings with community gardeners are being scheduled to address concerns of the gardeners and re-establish regular communication and support.
