Oakland International Airport awarded Level Two Airport Carbon Accreditation

Oakland International Airport (OAK), operated by the Port of Oakland (Port), was awarded Level Two status within Airports Council International's Airport Carbon Accreditation (ACA) program at the Airports Council International North America 2023 Annual Conference & Exhibition held in Long Beach, California last week. ACA is an international program that requires its airport members to commit to activities that reduce emissions and provide evidence of effective carbon management procedures. OAK met all requirements by:

- Developing carbon emission inventories for 2021 and 2022;
- Reducing carbon emissions year-over-year;
- Identifying a non-binding carbon emission reduction target (to reduce by 50 percent by 2030); and
- Developing a Carbon Management Plan.

OAK is actively pursuing the next levels of accreditation. Long term, OAK plans to reach zero emissions operations by 2040. The United States and Canada have committed to achieving net zero emissions at airports by 2050. The Airport Carbon Accreditation program has 548 airports participating worldwide.

Buildings & Energy

Oakland Awarded \$40 Million for Climate-Smart Housing

The City of Oakland was <u>awarded \$40 million</u> from the State's Infill Infrastructure Grant Catalytic (IIGC) program to provide more affordable housing in underserved neighborhoods and build greener and more walkable communities. Specifically, this investment will fund site preparation work including clearing, grubbing, and erosion

control. Utility improvements throughout the various housing sites will include a new sewer main, realignment of existing utilities and updating of existing utility lines. Roads will also be enhanced with new surfacing, curbs, gutters, and sidewalks. In addition, other capital improvements will include storm water management, landscaping, and environmental mitigation and remediation.



BayREN Business Energy Efficiency Program

The Bay Area Regional Energy Network (BayREN) is accepting applications from small businesses for its <u>commercial energy efficiency program</u>. Eligible businesses can receive incentives to install new air conditioning, Energy Star appliances, LED lighting, refrigeration equipment, and space and water heating equipment. In addition, free technical assistance is available from equipment evaluation to start-to-finish project service.

Oakland Wins \$8 Million for Urban Forests

Through the Inflation Reduction Act, the U.S. Forest Service awarded the City of Oakland <u>\$8 million in federal funding</u> for tree care and maintenance. Prioritizing

environmental justice communities, the City partnered with the <u>Oakland Parks and Recreation Foundation</u> and <u>Common Vision</u> to deliver on this successful application. The City will perform street tree maintenance while non-profit partners do community engagement, tree planting, and workforce development. For both Oakland Parks and Recreation Foundation and Common Vision, this grant is <u>more than just expanding Oakland's urban forest</u>; it's an "opportunity to bring the city and community members together, build relationships, and educate people about environmental stewardship in the neighborhoods that need it most," as Wanda Stewart, Executive Director of Common Vision explains.

Greenlining Institute Just Future Summit

Returning to their roots in Oakland for the first time since 2019, the Greenlining Institute is holding their annual conference, the <u>Just Future Summit</u> at the Oakland Convention Center on **October 19th and 20th**. One of the country's largest racial equity conferences, over 1000 participants will convene on the policies and priorities impacting communities of color at the intersection of racial, climate, and economic equity. Celebrating its 30th year of movement for a just economy, the Greenlining Institute works closely with communities of color to understand and transform racist barriers to economic opportunity and investment.



EJ4Climate Grant Program

The <u>EJ4Climate Grant Program</u> provides \$2 million funding directly to community-based organizations in underserved and vulnerable communities, and Indigenous communities, in Canada, Mexico, and the United States for environmental justice projects that address community empowerment strategies to improve resilience to extreme weather events in urban settings.

Proposals are due by **9 November 2023** and projects will be expected to begin in Spring 2024. Maximum award for each projects is \$200,000.
