

PLANNING COMMISSION BYLAWS

Presented to the Planning Commission on May 15, 2024

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Why are they needed?

- Planning Commission and related committees have been operating informally under Rosenberg's Rules of Order, but without formal bylaws for many years
- Since the Covid-19 pandemic, new technologies exist for remote or hybrid participation. But the City's Boards & Commission bylaws do not yet clarify how they may be used
- Commissioner roles and responsibilities, and public participation procedures need further clarification

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What do they seek to do?

- Establish an updated framework for conducting business and decision-making by the Planning Commission;
- Clarify roles and responsibilities of Commissioners and support staff;
- Clarify processes and procedures for hosting hybrid meetings; and
- 4. Clarify processes and procedures for public comment and participation at Planning Commission meetings

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What key principles are being affirmed?

- 1. Commissioners (under *very* limited circumstances) and members of the general public may participate in hybrid hearings, in keeping with State law.
- 2. Remote attendees at hybrid meetings must be able to participate *in an equal manner* as those in-person. For example, functionally comparable means of making public comments and viewing meetings must be made available.
- Speaker time shall be consistently and uniformly applied throughout meetings in accordance with the Brown Act.
