**5. Approval of Meeting Minutes**

The Commission reviewed the draft meeting minutes. A motion was made by Shirley Gee, seconded by Stephanie Goode, to approve the minutes for the meeting of July 14, 2021. **6. Public Hearing & Townhall Meeting Schedule**

Chair Tracy Richmond McKnight opened the discussion asking the Commissioners if they would like to amend or add dates to their adopted public hearing schedule. Commissioners engaged in a discussion involving turnaround times to produce draft district maps, increasing outreach efforts to make the public more aware about the current public hearing schedule, how the Commission could conduct in-person workshops in the fall, and the need for clear instructions in how Commissioners could capture and receive testimony during in-person workshops or engagements with the public. Commissioners also explored potential dates to hold in-person workshops and the possibility to partner with organizations that hold weekend meetings, such as the Black Cultural Zone, to gain a wider audience and receive additional public testimony.

A motion was made by Lilibeth Gangas, seconded by Diana Miller, to schedule workshops for October 24, 2021 and November 7, 2021. City staff recommended that the Commission not set dates as official motions since the workshops are non-Commission meetings, and recommended the Commission provide direction to City staff on criteria for scheduling workshops. The motion was later withdrawn after discussion.

**7. Outreach Consultant Proposed Scope of Work**

Alternate Commissioner Bharat Singh presented the Ad Hoc Committee's proposed outreach consultant scope of work. Commissioners discussed the importance for the future consultant to achieve as many tasks identified in the scope of work. City staff presented the process for how a consultant can be selected and brought under contract to work with the Commission.

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## **ACTION REQUESTED**

For the Redistricting Commission to:

1. Receive public testimony on communities of interest and the redistricting process.

## **SUMMARY**

This is the first of four (4) public hearings the Oakland Redistricting Commission has scheduled to receive testimony on communities of interest, the proposed draft maps and the redistricting process. The other public hearings will be held on September 8, 2021, October 13, 2021, and November 10, 2021. All Commission meetings begin at 5:00 pm; however, the public hearings will begin no earlier than 6:00 pm to allow additional time for the public to participate.

The August and September public hearings are intended to focus on communities of interest testimony, as the Commission is still awaiting 2020 U.S. Census data. Staff anticipates the data will be available in mid-September and the first draft maps could be produced by early-October. Therefore, the October and November public hearings would primarily focus on input on draft map proposals and information learned from the Census data release.

The Commission's deadline to adopt the final district maps is December 31, 2021. Additional public hearings or public workshops may be scheduled and residents are encouraged to register with the Commission on its website ([www.oaklandca.gov/redistricting](http://www.oaklandca.gov/redistricting)) to receive meeting notifications and updates.

This report is intended to provide guidance to the Redistricting Commission and public on receiving and offering testimony for the August 11, 2021 public hearing.

### ***Communities of Interest***

Under the FAIR MAPS Act, a Community of Interest is "a population that shares common social or economic interests that should be included within a single city council district for purposes of its effective and fair representation. Communities of interest do not include relationships with political parties, incumbents, or political candidates."

Community of Interest testimony should be received in four (4) ways:

- Verbal input at a public hearing.
- Mapping on the city public mapping tool, or any another mapping tool that the resident is more comfortable with.<sup>1</sup>
- Through a Community of Interest form (i.e. the Commission's online survey or a printed form for in-person engagements).
- An email to City staff supporting the work of the Commission ([rluna@oaklandca.gov](mailto:rluna@oaklandca.gov), [calvin@oaklandca.gov](mailto:calvin@oaklandca.gov)).

Ideally, community of interest testimony should include three elements:

- The name of the community and its shared culture or characteristics.
- The geographic footprint of the community – for example, where they live, work, worship or recreate in the city.
- The relationship with city government and answering the following question: Why they should be protected in a single district to enhance their representative and electoral power?

Community of interest testimony is subjective and as such, all testimony should be encouraged and received in an open and respectful manner. The testimony is not intended to be a back-and-forth question and answer session with the community. Rather, it is an opportunity for Commissioners to listen to the public.

If a member of the community does not address all these key questions in their testimony, it would be appropriate for the Chair to ask the member "what would you call your community" or "what is your relationship with the city," provided that it is done with the intent of helping the member provide more effective testimony.
