# OAKLAND REDISTRICTING COMMISSION RESOLUTION NO. 22-004

# RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE FINAL MAP FOR THE DECENNIAL OAKLAND REDISTRICTING PROCESS.

**WHEREAS**, on November 4, 2014, Oakland voters approved Measure DD establishing an independent Redistricting Commission with 61.45% in favor of the measure; and

WHEREAS, Measure DD established a 15-member Redistricting Commission tasked with re-drawing the boundary lines for City Council and Oakland Unified School Board of Directors districts following the U.S. Census; and

**WHEREAS**, Measure DD created Section 220 of the Oakland City Charter; and

WHEREAS, Oakland City Charter Section 220(G) states the Commission shall adopt a final plan and map for the City of Oakland specifically describing the district boundaries for each of the City Council and Oakland Unified School Board of Directors districts; and

WHEREAS, the Redistricting Commission has taken public testimony pursuant to Elections Code Section 21627.1, including one (1) public hearing held prior to the drawing of a draft map, two (2) public hearings held after the drawing of draft maps, and thirteen (13) additional public hearings occurring between October 2021 and January 2022, all of which occurred after 6 p.m. on a weekday; and

WHEREAS, the Redistricting Commission held six (6) Redistricting Workshops, including during weekends, to solicit additional public feedback on proposed draft maps pursuant to Elections Code Section 21627.1; and

WHEREAS, Section 220(L)(5) of the Oakland City Charter requires a final map to have been publicly displayed for at least fourteen (14) days prior to final adoption; and

- **WHEREAS**, the Redistricting Commission publicly displayed Draft Plan "F5" on the City of Oakland Redistricting website beginning on January 29, 2022; and
- **WHEREAS**, Section 220(D)(3) of the Oakland City Charter requires the final map to be adopted by nine (9) affirmative votes; now therefore be it
- **RESOLVED**: That the Oakland Redistricting Commission adopts Draft Map "F5" as the Final Map for the 2020-2030 decennial redistricting process; and
- **FURTHER RESOLVED:** That the Oakland Redistricting Commission designates "Draft District A1" as "District 1"; and
- **FURTHER RESOLVED:** That the Oakland Redistricting Commission designates "Draft District B2" as "District 2"; and
- **FURTHER RESOLVED:** That the Oakland Redistricting Commission designates "Draft District C3" as "District 3"; and
- **FURTHER RESOLVED:** That the Oakland Redistricting Commission designates "Draft District D4" as "District 4"; and
- **FURTHER RESOLVED:** That the Oakland Redistricting Commission designates "Draft District E5" as "District 5"; and
- **FURTHER RESOLVED:** That the Oakland Redistricting Commission designates "Draft District F6" as "District 6"; and
- **FURTHER RESOLVED:** That the Oakland Redistricting Commission designates "Draft District G7" as "District 7"; and



#### OAKLAND REDISTRICTING COMMISSION

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 22-003**

RESOLUTION DETERMINING THAT CONDUCTING IN-PERSON MEETINGS OF THE OAKLAND REDISTRICTING COMMISSION AND ITS COMMITTEES WOULD PRESENT IMMINENT RISKS TO ATTENDEES' HEALTH, AND ELECTING TO CONTINUE CONDUCTING MEETINGS USING TELECONFERENCING IN ACCORDANCE WITH CALIFORNIA GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 54953(e) AS AMENDED BY CALIFORNIA ASSEMBLY BILL NO. AB-361 (SEPTEMBER 16, 2021).

**WHEREAS**, on March 4, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom declared a state of emergency related to COVID-19, pursuant to Government Code Section 8625, and such declaration has not been lifted or rescinded,

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, the City Administrator in their capacity as the Director of the Emergency Operations Center (EOC), issued a proclamation of local emergency due to the spread of COVID-19 in Oakland, and on March 12, 2020, the City Council passed Resolution No. 88075 C.M.S. ratifying the proclamation of local emergency pursuant to Oakland Municipal Code (O.M.C.) section 8.50.050(C); and

**WHEREAS**, City Council Resolution No. 88075 remains in full force and effect to date; and

**WHEREAS**, the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) recommends physical distancing of at least six (6) feet whenever possible, avoiding crowds, and avoiding spaces that do not offer fresh air from the outdoors, particularly for people who are not fully vaccinated or who are at higher risk of getting very sick from COVID-19. **WHEREAS**, the CDC recommends that people who live with unvaccinated people avoid activities that make physical distancing difficult, See <a href="https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/your-health/about-covid-19/caring-for-children/families.html">https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/your-health/about-covid-19/caring-for-children/families.html</a>; and

- **WHEREAS**, the CDC recommends that older adults limit in-person interactions as much as possible, particularly when indoors. *See* <a href="https://www.cdc.gov/aging/covid19/covid19-older-adults.html">https://www.cdc.gov/aging/covid19/covid19-older-adults.html</a>; and
- **WHEREAS**, the CDC, the California Department of Public Health, and the Alameda County Public Health Department all recommend that people experiencing COVID-19 symptoms stay home,

- **WHEREAS**, persons without symptoms may be able to spread the COVID-19 virus, See <a href="https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/prevention.html">https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/prevention.html</a>; and
- WHEREAS, fully vaccinated persons who become infected with the COVID-19 Omicron variant can spread the virus to others, See <a href="https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/vaccines/fully-vaccinated.html">https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/vaccines/fully-vaccinated.html</a>; and
- **WHEREAS**, the City's public-meeting facilities are indoor facilities that are not designed to ensure circulation of fresh / outdoor air, particularly during periods of cold and/or rainy weather; and
- **WHEREAS**, the City's public-meeting facilities are not designed to ensure that attendees can remain six (6) feet apart; and
- WHEREAS, holding in-person meetings would encourage community members from different households to come to City facilities to participate in local government, and some of them would be at high risk of getting very sick from COVID-19 and/or would live with someone who is at high risk; and
- WHEREAS, in-person meetings will bring community members who are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms to leave their homes in order to come to City facilities and participate in local government; and
- WHEREAS, some attendees would use ride-share services or public transit to travel to in-person meetings, thereby putting them in close and prolonged contact with additional people outside of their households; and
- WHEREAS, on September 29, 2021, Commissioners adopted a resolution determining that conducting in-person meetings of the Oakland Redistricting Commission and its committees would present imminent risks to attendees' health, and electing to continue conducting meetings using teleconferencing in accordance with California Government Code Section 54953(e) as amended by California Assembly Bill No. AB-361 (September 16, 2021); now therefore be it:

**RESOLVED:** that the Oakland Redistricting Commission finds and determines that the foregoing recitals are true and correct and hereby adopts and incorporates them into this Resolution; and be it

**FURTHER RESOLVED:** that, based on these determinations and consistent with federal, state and local health guidance, the Oakland Redistricting Commission renews its determination that conducting in-person meetings would pose imminent risks to the health of attendees; and be it

**FURTHER RESOLVED:** that the Oakland Redistricting Commission firmly believes that the community's health and safety seriously and the community's right to participate in local government, are both critically important, and is committed to balancing the two by continuing to use teleconferencing to conduct public meetings, in accordance with California Government Code Section 54953(e), a provision of AB-361; and be it

**FURTHER RESOLVED:** that the Oakland Redistricting Commission will renew these (or similar) findings at least every thirty (30) days in accordance with California Government Code section 54953(e) until the state of emergency related to COVID-19 has been lifted, or the Oakland Redistricting Commission finds that in-person meetings no longer pose imminent risks to the health of attendees, whichever is occurs first.
