

Creek to Bay Day with Friends of Sausal Creek

Volunteer with Friends of Sausal Creek this Creek to Bay Day! We have several projects planned across the watershed to help keep our city and water clean. At Dimond Park, we're teaming up with the [Oakland Museum of California](#) to offer some educational activities in addition to restoration and clean-up.



Lake Merritt Project Improves Oxygen Levels and Water Quality for Wildlife

[Oakland installed a new aeration fountain in Lake Merritt](#)— one piece of an ongoing effort to maintain healthy conditions for fish and wildlife at the Lake. This new device is part of the [Lake Merritt Water Quality Management Pilot Project](#), initiated in response to the 2022 Harmful Algal Bloom (HAB). The Pilot is designed to begin addressing excessive algae growth and the low dissolved oxygen levels associated with the fish kill.

By mixing air into the water, the fountain will improve dissolved oxygen levels in the Lake, helping to maintain an oxygenated refuge for aquatic life near the fountain. The design and spray settings on the new fountain maximize benefit to wildlife.

While these devices cannot *prevent* HABs, they are one tool that—together with other interventions—may help mitigate their impact on the Lake.

OakDOT Releases RFP for E-Bike Lending Program

The City of Oakland Department of Transportation (OakDOT) is launching an [electric bike \(e-bike\) lending program Request for Proposals \(RFP\)](#) to provide priority communities with access to affordable medium and long-term rentals of zero-emissions mobility options, including cargo bikes and adaptive bikes. Two RFPs are available: one to run the operations of the program and another to perform maintenance. Interested parties must register with the [City of Oakland iSupplier database](#) and applications are due **October 2nd**.



Oakland International Airport Sets Goal of Zero Emissions Operations by 2040

As part of the Port of Oakland's road to zero emissions, the Port is developing an aggressive program to reduce carbon emissions at Oakland International Airport (OAK). OAK is pursuing a Level 2 certification under the [Airport Carbon Accreditation](#) program to reduce GHG emissions caused by the combustion of fuels as well as emissions caused by generating electricity from sources that are controlled or owned by the Port of Oakland. The Port of Oakland is proposing a non-binding target of a 50% reduction of GHG emissions, also known as carbon emissions, by 2030. The goal is to reach zero emissions operations at OAK by 2040. TECH Multifamily Home Incentives

TECH Clean California is offering [substantial incentives direct to contractors](#) to support the installation of heat pump technologies in existing multifamily buildings throughout the state of California. These incentives (along with incentives for existing single-family homes) are available only to contractors enrolled in TECH Clean California. TECH enrolled contractors or property owners can submit a reservation, however, both must complete a digital signature request, after the Association for Energy Affordability (AEA) has completed an initial reservation review.

- Reservations must be made to qualify for incentives
- Applications are processed on a first come, first served basis





Discount Solar and Battery Storage from Bay Area SunShares

[Bay Area SunShares](https://www.bayareasunshares.org) provides a discount on turnkey solar installations and home battery storage. Any resident in the Bay Area's 9 counties (Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Napa, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Solano, and Sonoma) can sign up for the SunShares discount at www.bayareasunshares.org between **September 1st and November 15th, 2023**. SunShares is administered by the [Business Council on Climate Change](https://www.bayareasunshares.org).



EBCE Health-e Home Program and 2023 Commercial Rebates

EBCE's Health-e Home program, in partnership with BlocPower and Revalue.io, provides low- to moderate-income homeowners with affordable financing options to gain access to the health and safety benefits of transitioning to clean energy and electric appliances. The Health-e Home program also supports health and safety improvements such as wiring upgrades and roofing repairs—all to help reduce indoor air pollution, increase resiliency during extreme weather events, and potentially increase home value. Induction Cooktop Lending Program and Rebates!

The induction Cooktop lending Program is available to all residential electricity customers residing in the East Bay--EBCE customers as well as non-customers who receive service from PG&E.
- **PG&E:** PG&E's new Induction Cooktop Loaner Program offers plug-in countertop induction units for two-weeks, at no cost, to all residents. To borrow and learn more about induction cooking, visit pge.com/inductionloaner where you can start the loan process. PG&E will provide shipping details and cover shipping costs.

EBCE is also offering **up to \$300** per eligible residential customer for an induction cooktop/range, when you replace an existing gas appliance. EBCE Resilient Home Program

With **Resilient Home**, EBCE has done the upfront legwork to select an experienced partner, Sunrun, and pre-negotiated solar and battery backup system incentives for Oakland homeowners. To further lower customer costs, Sunrun will pay homeowners \$1,250 after installation for agreeing to share their stored energy with EBCE when demand on the power grid is high. This will help the grid operate more reliably, and cut carbon emissions and costs for all EBCE customers.
