Suggestions and Recommendations

Vision and Mission Statement:

- Use Seattle's concise vision as inspiration but tailor it to Oakland's unique context.
 - Seattle CPC Example:
 - <u>Vision</u>: envisions communities and the aligned in shared goals of safety, respect, and accountability:
 - Vision: The Seattle Community Police Commission (CPC) envisions communities and the Seattle Police Department (SPD) aligned in shared goals of safety, respect, and accountability.
 - Mission: The CPC listens to, amplifies, and builds common ground among communities affected by policing in Seattle.

Focus Areas:

- Consolidate ad hoc committees into broader categories like policy development, community engagement, and oversight.
- Develop SMART goals (Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, Time-Bound).

Proactive Oversight:

- Leverage data and insights from the Inspector General's reports to drive accountability.
- Engage national experts for guidance on oversight models and NSA transition strategies.

Community Engagement:

- Increase transparency through accessible reports and regular public forums.
- Create a master calendar for community events to enhance participation.

Internal Operations:

- Develop robust orientation and training programs for new members.
- Establish clear succession plans for key roles within the Commission.

Next Steps

1. Finalize Vision and Mission Statement:

- Commissioners to submit additional feedback to Ad Hoc Chair Angela Jackson-Castain and Commission Vice Chair Karely Ordaz.
- Ad Hoc Chair Angela Jackson-Castain and Vice Chair Karely Ordaz to consolidate input into a final draft.

2. Develop Focus Area Plans:

- Ad hoc committees to align their work with the agreed focus areas.
- Ad Hoc Chair Angela Jackson-Castain to draft the initial SMART goals for each focus area.

3. Enhance Community Engagement:

- o Schedule community forums for Q1 2025.
- Develop a communication strategy with infographics and accessible materials.

4. Prepare for NSA Transition:

- Schedule meetings with national experts to discuss oversight models.
- Begin drafting a strategic transition plan.
