


DECADE OF GROWTH AND CHANGE

LANGUAGE SPOKEN AT HOME (2019)




RACIAL/ETHNIC BREAKDOWN **OF TRI-VALLEY 2010 V. 2019**




TRUE COST OF LIVING



STUDENTS PARTICIPATING IN FREE & REDUCED PRICED MEAL PROGRAM (2019-20)





The 2019 Community Health Needs Assessment for Stanford Health Care-ValleyCare lists behavioral health (**mental health**), **health care access and delivery**, and **housing and homelessness** as the top three community health needs.

The <u>Tri-Valley Anti-Poverty Collaborative (TVAPC)</u>, a project of the Tri-Valley Nonprofit Alliance, is a cross-sector collaboration formed to bring light to the issue of hidden poverty in this community. Over forty organizations participate with TVAPC; representing government agencies, school districts, nonprofits and safety net service providers, the business community, faith-based organizations, and residents. TVAPC brings attention to the upstream variables that lead to disparities in economic, health, education, and quality of life outcomes called the Social Determinants of Health and advocates for the redress of inequitable conditions.
