Re: Amendments to Local Preference Legislation from 5/31/16 CED Committee

Dear Members of the City Council:

Please find attached the final version of the Local Preference Legislation as amended by the CED committee on 5/31/16. I'm proud to be joined by two cosponsors, Councilmembers Abel Guillén and Dan Kalb, in bringing forward these important reforms to our affordable housing preference system.

Included in this supplemental report are a clean version and a red lined version of the proposed ordinance that incorporates the changes made at the CED committee. These changes were:

- Including the displacee preference as one of the categories eligible for first time home-buyer mortgage assistance programs in addition to those who live or work in the City of Oakland.
- Amending the definition of local preference to include people who live within a mile of an affordable housing development in addition to those who live in the Council district.

The following charts summarize the current system and the system proposed by the ordinance under consideration by the City Council.
