5. Prop. 1B Paving List Bikeway Nexus	Jason Patton reported on the coordination of bikeway implementation in conjunction with the 5 Year Road Resurfacing Plan, resurfacing activities by utility companies, etc. Jason presented a matrix that showed all of the streets on the 5-Year plan that are on the bikeway network and prioritized each based on a number of factors. Difficulty of coordination greater when lane conversions are involved due to the longer lead time required for study, outreach and council approval. Projects that don't remove travel lanes are easier to implement.  Robert, Jonathan: Would like to prioritize E 12 <sup>th</sup> St. or any East Oakland areas Robert: 16 <sup>th</sup> Ave overpass; Jason response: CalTrans permit would be required Robert: Consider Adeline; Jason response: already parallels existing striped bikeways on Market and MLK, not on the list of priority projects on bike plan Golf Links & Claremont streets connect to several recreational destinations Brian: Foothill Blvd connecting to Lake Merritt would be a nice tie in to Measure DD projects Jim: Would like to see crosswalk policy. Jason response: Per current policy, curb ramps are brought into ADA compliance in conjunction with resurfacing projects. Crosswalk policy is in draft form; staff has limited time and resources to finalize the policy for the moment. Jonathan: Would like to preview the draft policy if available. Jennifer S: Piedmont Ave is on list and on bike plan. Wider sidewalks would be nice (and might be a priority for the community), but would be very expensive and no funding is available. Ron: Curb ramps should be targeted to areas serving the visually impaired population, e.g., near the Lyon [sp?] Center

Alterations to lockers in Oakland completed on Monday  Robert announced that the Measure DD request for bids may have successfully found a repaving/restriping contractor for the Lakeshore project. Ron added that the proposal being constructed ("Plan B") does not include an expansion to the park.
