

Commercial Trash and Compost Collection Rates Effective July 1

New colored carts and bins are slowly being delivered in Oakland for SB 1383 compliance.



The City of Oakland Environmental Enforcement Officers are working hard to enforce mandatory trash collection and stop illegal dumping. Together, we can keep Oakland clean. Know the rules:

- All trash, compost, and recycling generated by your business must be stored in your service container and serviced weekly (OMC 8.28.140).
- It is unlawful for any person to put trash from their business or home in, on top of, or alongside the street litter containers placed in the sidewalk area. Street litter containers are for use by pedestrians depositing small waste carried by them (OMC 8.29.160).
- It is unlawful for any person to illegally dump or improperly dispose of waste matter (OMC 8.11.310).

Property Owners Must Also:



INFORM

Inform businesses, residents, employees, and contractors each year about trash, compost, and recycle rules.



EDUCATE

Train tenants to separate trash, compost, and recyclables when they move-in or move-out. Request service brochures to give to tenants at www.oaklandrecycles.com/services/free-tools-resources.



PROMOTE

Post signs, posters, and/or affix labels to bins to ensure the right materials go in the right bins. Order free signs and posters at www.oaklandrecycles.com/services/free-tools-resources. Free help and indoor green bins are also available.



ACCESS

Place trash, compost and recycle bins together both indoors and outdoors. Restrooms are not required to have recycle or compost collection however the City encourages collection of paper towels for composting from restrooms.
